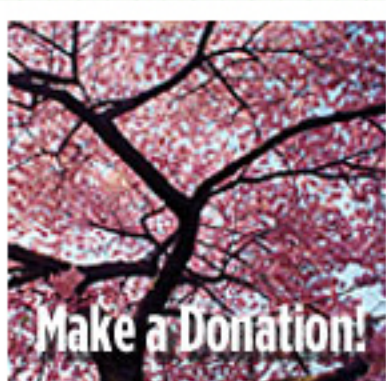

## Homeowner Tree Giveaway Program Putting Down Roots

This spring MillionTreesNYC and JetBlue Airways will help New York homeowners put down roots by planting trees in the Bronx, Brooklyn, Queens and Staten Island. With additional funding from American Express, five additional giveaways were added in neighborhoods ravaged by the September 16, 2010 tornadoes, as an effort to replant the more than 3,000 trees which were lost in the storms.

Beginning March 26th, MillionTreesNYC will join with community organizations to give New Yorkers 3,500 free trees – one per household – to help increase the health, environmental and economic benefits trees bring to our city and its residents. To reach our one million tree goal, New York City homeowners, developers and landowners are needed to plant 200,000 trees on front and back yards and private property.

## Reforestation Stewardship Training

Want to help care for growing forests in natural areas of our city parks? MillionTreesNYC is also looking for dedicated volunteers to join our **Reforestation Stewardship Corps** and adopt a reforestation site at Alley Pond Park (Queens), Pelham Bay Park (Bronx), Clove Lakes Park (Staten Island) or Marine Park (Brooklyn). Volunteers will be trained by the NYC Parks Department Natural Resources Group in three sessions, and then commit to caring for and monitoring their site for twelve hours over the summer. MillionTreesNYC will provide volunteer stewards with tools and training.
